One day, I was volunteering at the Front Desk for East Whittier YMCA. I wanted to try something new. For example, working somewhere where they accept and welcome people with disabilities. On March 28, 2015, I applied to Farrell's Ice Cream Parlor in Brea, Ca. I had to fill out a job application. I also included my resume. With in two days, I was coming out of a job interview from Knott's Berry Farm in Buena Park, Ca. I missed the call. I called back and see who it was, and it was from Farrell's. The lady form the restaurant told me she wanted to set up a job interview. On April 1, 2015, I attended the interview. I was little bit nervous because it was a new chapter for me. While at the interview, I disclosed my disability. Overall, the interview went very well. Monday, April 6, 2015, I followed up with the manager to see if I got the job. Around afternoon that day, I got a job, and I was so excited because I want to have a income for myself. April 8, 2015, I went to orientation. I started working on April 17, 2015. My family supported me, but I did it independently most of all with out the California Dept. of Rehabilitation.

When I first started working there, I did not know what to do first on the job. The Eastern Los Angeles Regional Center provided a Job Coach under Community Integration Training (CIT), for checking on me and see how I was doing at work. We also worked on soft skills. A month and half later, I got employee of the month in May. I was not expected for anything, I only had a Job Coach for 2 months. I asked my managers lot of questions while on my ninety days probation.

When I first go hired at Farrell's, I worked 2 to 3 days; however, the company is starting to go out of business. I only work 1 day since August of 2016 during the difficult times. The only time I need support from In2Vision if I have a problem at work. My managers and staff would discuss how I am I am doing, and review my performance.



The other two jobs I had was East Whittier YMCA volunteer work, and Sears for seasonal. While working at Farrell's Ice Cream, I continue to go school full time.
